Procal, a product containing primarily calcium sulphate with various contaminates was applied at 300 and 500 lb per acre in field-scale tests laid down on two locations in each of 1966 and 1967. Moderate amounts of salinity were present in the soil at all locations. The yield data given for the three wheat tests and the one forage test support the conclusion that Procal, applied at the rate of application recommended by the distributors, is of no value.
